From Our Pastor



It is fairly common knowledge around here that I enjoy babies. I've found myself particularly excited over the number of babies who have been born to church families recently, and incredibly grateful that so many of the parents are comfortable with me cuddling, cooing over, and kissing their babies. Life can be very good as a pastor.

In October we are going to baptize two more babies into our church family, and promise together to surround and their families "with a community of love and forgiveness, that

they may grow in their trust of God and be found faithful in their services to others." I've sat down with the families to explain how deeply the church wishes to keep its promises, and the families are grateful for the church's love and support.

This has helped to reflect on what we're offering to children and youth within our community. As I made the list, I was shocked at how wonderful it is!

- While babies and toddlers are welcome in our worship service, we also have rocking chairs in the Narthex if soothing is needed, and the Babyfold staffed and available when play is the best choice.
- We have Children's Time in worship, when the needs of kids take precedence.
- Starting this fall, we've moved Sunday School to 9AM, which does two great things. It allows both
 the children of our church members and the children who come to breakfast access to Christian
 Education. It also makes more space for kids in worship, so that they become familiar with the
 ebbs, flows, and themes of our worship itself.
- Starting in November, we're going to use Family Sunday's differently. Family Sundays remain the first Sunday of the month, and the 9AM Sunday School will not happen. Instead, for the 2nd Hour (after worship) there will be a chance for our children AND any adults who wish to, to play our Orff instruments together. We're hoping to work on an Advent arrangement together, to be played during worship in December. Instruction in sacred music is inherently good, and fun!
- Starting on October 4th, I'll be teaching Confirmation class again, this time to a MUCH larger class then I've see in my time here. Young people will have the time and space to ask questions, and to experience worship in other faith traditions!
- Our Youth Group has been going strong for several years now, and our youth are pretty obsessed with Mission. Their last trip was to Henderson Settlement in August, with 6 youth and 2 adults in attendance. Our youth also like to do service projects back home, and often work in conjunction with the youth at Emmanuel Friedens.

See? It is pretty impressive all laid out. I've also been thinking about why we do all of this. First and foremost, in all that we do, we aim to create a safe and supportive environment for young people. That may be obvious, but it isn't trivial. For many young people, the world is full of dangers, and we do all that we can to be a place of refuge.

We also aim to teach. Sometimes, with our youngest kids, the teaching is the safe and supportive environment – there is nothing that teaches a baby that God is good better than attentive loving care! As children grow, we seek to familiarize them with Bible stories as a foundation for faith development. We also encourage question asking all along the way. When it is developmentally appropriate, we also teach theology. We teach that God's love extends to ALL people. We teach that because of God's love for all people, God wants a world that supports all people. In all of this, we aim to make space for each young person and their needs. We aren't trying to indoctrinate, we are offering what we've come to know and value.

I suspect it is discouraging sometimes, especially for those who remember the days when the Sunday School classes overflowed, that we don't have more young people. It is OK to remember, and notice the difference. It is definitely OK to have enough love to share, and want to be able to share it.

Yet, we are doing wonderful ministry, and I know it is making a difference in people's lives. The babies in our community will be well cared for, as are their parents, and they are certainly a part of a community of love and forgiveness. I think there is a lot to celebrate, both in our young people and in what we are able to offer to them!

Would you like to help hurricane victims?

Do you feel helpless when you hear news of Hurricane Florence stalled



over the Carolinas, producing up to 36" of rain over four days, leaving rivers overflowing and houses, businesses and fields flooded? As the waters recede, people are faced with a massive cleanup from the storm damage and flooding. Where do you begin and how?

United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is a global humanitarian aid and development organization of the United Methodist Church, known to be "fast in and last out." In a crisis, UMCOR shows up and distributes hundreds of *Cleaning Kits/flood buckets.* A Cleaning Kit is a five gallon bucket containing gloves, respirator dust marks, concentrated household cleaner, dish soap, laundry detergent, sponges, a scrub brush, clothesline and clothespins, two dozen large heavy-duty trash bags, and more.

The Cleaning Kits are sent to all disasters in the United States. As of 2018, international shipping has been terminated because it is no longer the fastest or most effective way to respond to a disaster. Instead, UMCOR now provides funding through grants which allows the purchase of kit items locally. This stimulates the local economy, increases employment, and insures that kit items are culturally appropriate.

UMCOR assembles these kits and ships out hundreds after each storm. UMCOR responded to 44 disasters in 2017. The cost of the numerous items in one Cleaning Kit is \$75.00. Here is a direct way you can help hurricane victims. Donate any amount you are able to give to FUMC (checks payable to FUMC) with this notation on any check or letter you send: UMCOR -Cleaning Kits. Place it in the offering plate and it will be sent to UMCOR for this purpose.

The Sunday School Scoop

Sunday School begins October 14 (9:00—9:45 am)

The Children and Youth Ministry team is developing new programs for children in Grs. K—6. We will not have Sunday School like we did last year. Instead we will have something different!!




► Attend United Methodist Women Events! All women are welcome at these events:


